Polygraphs

Question: Does an individual need two years of polygraph experience in criminal cases to meet the minimum requirements of the Request for Proposal?

Answer: Yes, a polygrapher needs two years of criminal experience to meet the minimum standards set forth in the Request for Proposal.

Question: The "group" sessions have been offered over the years as two hour group sessions. The "client" sessions have been offered as 30 minute units per client. Am I reading the solicitation correct that the "group" sessions will be offered as 30 minute units per client? Or is it 30 minute units per two hour group?

Answer: All the solicitations are now in 30-minute unit per client increments. For example, a 2-hour group would be four (4) 30-minute units per client.

Question: What type of training is required for Getting It Right?
re: 1.3 Scope

(a) A trained facilitator shall successfully complete training for the specific manualized CBT program being utilized. The completion of such training shall be documented. A trained facilitator shall not be required to have clinical oversight;

Answer: The reference to the facilitator training requirement under 1.3 SCOPE (a) is canned language under the Request for Quotation for Services. The Change Companies "Getting It Right" curriculum does not require a formal training in order to deliver a manualized cognitive behavioral group under the described solicitation.
